Designators:

V02a: Voice in AM

M08a: Morse

HM01: Voice announcements in AM, files were sent in RDFT. Since Feb. 22nd 2022 WinDRM is being used

SK01: No voice announcements, files sent in WinDRM

Notes:

- a. V02a ceased to exist. The schedules indicate irregular appearances since its demise. It usually pops up on a fixed HM01/M08a schedule and transmits in LSB.
- b. M08a ceased to exist. The schedules indicate irregular appearances since its demise.
- c. All HM01 schedules start at +/- hh:00 and are repeated at hh:30. Often a bit earlier or later.
- d. SK01 is the predecessor of HM01. Although RDFT replaced WinDRM in 2012, the station still uses this mode occasionally.
